

NEW HAMPSHIRE TERM LIMITS POLL: EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

US Term Limits survey conducted Jan 2-6, 2025 by RMG Research Group. 501 Registered Voters in New Hampshire participated in the survey.

A large majority (84%) of New Hampshire voters approve of placing term limits on Congress. 81% of voters favor having New Hampshire call for an amendment proposing convention to enact congressional term limits. Additionally, 74% of voters state that they would be more likely to vote for a candidate for state legislature who supports implementing term limits for members of Congress.

Methodology

The survey of 501 registered New Hampshire voters was conducted for USTL on January 2-6. Field work for the survey was conducted by RMG Research, Inc. Certain quotas were applied, and the sample was lightly weighted by gender, age, and race.

The margin of sampling error for the full sample is +/- 4.4 percentage points.
